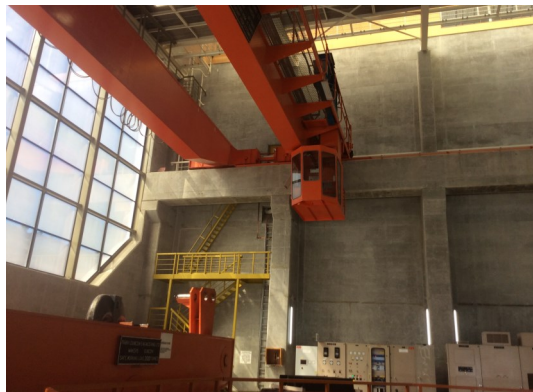

## Building Blocks for Building Buddies

A social development programme that helps children build buddies through structured Lego sessions. Children that typically benefit most might have individual needs, social communication issues, sensory needs or language delay. The programme is based on the highly structured, systematic and predictable nature of LEGO play, which appeals to children with social communication difficulties who are particularly attracted to systems. Much more than simply playing with building blocks, **Building Blocks for Building Buddies** is structured and guided by trained teachers who direct the children and encourage them to address and resolve problems. Through **Building Blocks** children learn to communicate with others, express their feelings, change their behaviour, develop problem-solving skills and develop a relationship with the world around them.

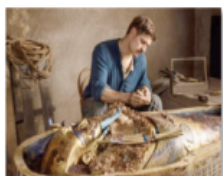


## All the World's a Stage – Creative Writing
